What is the General Conference?	The General Conference meets every 4 years (quadrennially) and is the supreme body of the AMEC. It is made up of the Bishops, and an equal number of ministers and lay delegates. The delegates are elected by each Annual Conference.
What is the Council of Bishops?	The Council of Bishops is the Executive Branch of the Connectional Church. They meet annually and discharges the responsibility as the Executive Branch.
What is the Board of Incorporators?	The Board of Incorporators, also known as the General Board of Trustees has the supervision in trust of all Connectional property of the Church and is vested with authority to act in behalf of the Connectional Church wherever necessary.
What is the General Board?	The General Board is the administrative body and is comprised of various departmental Commissions, made up of the Executive Director, General Secretary of the AME Church, the Chief Financial Officer, the members of the various Commissions, and one bishop as the presiding officer with the other Bishops associating
What is the Judicial Council?	The Judicial Council is the highest judicatory body of the AME Church. It is an appellate court, elected by the General Conference.
What does the word "African" mean in the word African Methodist Episcopal?	The word African means that the church was organized by people of African descent and heritage.
What does the word "Methodist" means in the word African Methodist Episcopal?	The church roots are of the family of Methodist churches. Methodism provides an orderly system of rules and regulations and places emphasis on plain and simple gospel.
What does the word "Episcopal "means in the word African Methodist Episcopal?	Episcopal refers to the form of government under which the church operates. The Chief Executives and administrative officer of the AME Church are the Bishops of the church.
